## **Summary Annual Report**

# Carpenters Health and Security Plan of Western Washington

This is a summary of the annual report of the Carpenters Health and Security Plan of Western Washington, E.I.N. 91-6029049, Plan No. 501, for the year ended December 31, 2018. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Board of Trustees of the Carpenters Health and Security Plan of Western Washington has committed itself to pay certain medical, prescription, dental, vision, and time loss claims incurred under the terms of the plan.

#### Insurance Information

The plan has contracts with UnitedHealthcare of Washington Inc. and LifeMap Assurance Company to pay life insurance and health benefits incurred under the terms of the plan. Total premiums paid for the plan year ended December 31, 2018 were \$1,134,000.

Because certain insurance contracts are experience rated, the premium costs are affected by, among other things, the number and size of claims. Premiums paid under experience-rated contracts for the plan year ended December 31, 2018 were \$737,686 and the total of all benefit claims paid under experience-rated contracts during the plan year was \$492,870.

#### **Basic Financial Statement**

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$178,183,513 as of December 31, 2018, compared to \$191,885,076 as of January 1, 2018. During the plan year, the plan experienced a decrease in its net assets of (\$13,701,563). This decrease includes realized and unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year, or the cost of assets acquired during the year. During the plan year, the plan had total income of \$151,502,527 including employer contributions of \$143,597,759 employee contributions of \$9,955,357, losses from investments of (\$2,191,061) and other income of \$140,472.

Plan expenses were \$165,204,090. These expenses included \$5,839,701 in administrative expenses and \$159,364,389 in benefits paid to or for participants and beneficiaries.
